

# Hospitals that make history

The NHS was created in 1948. With a continuing commitment to provide care for all, based on clinical need and free at the point of delivery, it remains one of the UK's proudest achievements. It has enabled and supported some of the biggest advances in health and care worldwide. While the hospitals and people who make up Imperial College Healthcare have an even longer track record of innovation and achievement, they have played an important role in shaping the NHS – from the start.

<p>Prof Francis Crick and Dr James Watson discover the structure of DNA.</p> <p><b>1953</b></p>		<p>Sir Richard Doll establishes a clear link between smoking and lung cancer.</p> <p><b>1954</b></p>	<p>The UK's first heart-lung machine, developed by Prof Denis Melrose, is used at Hammersmith Hospital. Prof Melrose also pioneers a technique for safely stopping the heart during surgery.</p> <p><b>1957</b></p>	 <p>The UK's first successful kidney transplant takes place at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.</p> <p><b>1960</b></p>	<p>Queen Charlotte's consultant obstetrician Sultan Karim is the first to report on the clinical use of prostaglandins to initiate labour.</p> <p><b>1967</b></p>	<p>CT scans are introduced.</p> <p><b>1970</b></p>	<p>The first case of AIDS in the UK is identified at the Princes Street Clinic at St Mary's Hospital.</p> <p><b>1981</b></p>	<p>Hammersmith Hospital becomes a special health authority.</p> <p><b>1982</b></p>	<p>Merger of Charing Cross and Westminster hospitals medical schools.</p> <p><b>1984</b></p>	<p>The first heart, lung, and liver transplant is carried out at Papworth Hospital.</p> <p><b>1986</b></p>	<p>The Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother Building opens at St Mary's Hospital.</p> <p><b>1988</b></p>	<p>The hyper-acute stroke unit opens at Charing Cross Hospital as part of a London-wide programme to consolidate specialist services in order to improve outcomes.</p> <p><b>2009</b></p>	<p>Hammersmith Hospital's heart attack centre opens as part of a London-wide programme to consolidate specialist services in order to improve outcomes.</p> <p><b>2010</b></p>	<p>In a UK first, focused ultrasound is used at Charing Cross Hospital to treat debilitating tremors, avoiding brain surgery.</p> <p><b>2016</b></p>
<p>First daily pollen count in the UK begins – set up by Dr AW Frankland at St Mary's Hospital to cover London.</p> <p><b>1949</b></p>		<p>Hammersmith Hospital becomes the first hospital in the world to have a medical cyclotron, a particle accelerator with many applications including radiotherapy and advanced imaging.</p> <p><b>1955</b></p>	<p>Prof Rodney Porter, working at St Mary's Hospital Medical School, discovers the 4-chain structure of antibody molecules, for which he later receives a Nobel Prize.</p> <p><b>1962</b></p>	<p>Her Majesty the Queen officially opens the new Charing Cross Hospital on Fulham Palace Road.</p> <p><b>1973</b></p>		<p>Charing Cross Hospital establishes one of two centres providing a national screening service for choriocarcinoma, a rare cancer linked to pregnancy.</p> <p><b>1983</b></p>	<p>Queen Charlotte's Hospital and Chelsea Hospital for Women merges with the Hammersmith Hospital to form the Hammersmith and Queen Charlotte's Special Health Authority.</p> <p><b>1984</b></p>	<p>Comprehensive national breast screening programme is introduced.</p> <p><b>1988</b></p>	<p>Averil Mansfield, consultant vascular surgeon at St Mary's Hospital, becomes the UK's first female professor of surgery.</p> <p><b>1993</b></p>	<p>Hammersmith Hospitals NHS Trust is formed from the merger of Hammersmith, Charing Cross, Queen Charlotte's and Chelsea and Acton hospitals.</p> <p><b>1994</b></p>	<p>Charing Cross and Westminster Medical School merges with Imperial College, The National Heart and Lung Institute and the Royal Postgraduate Medical School to form Imperial College School of Medicine.</p> <p><b>1997</b></p>	<p>Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust is formed by the merger of St Mary's and Hammersmith Hospitals NHS trusts.</p> <p><b>2007</b></p>	<p>St Mary's Hospital becomes one of four major trauma centres designated for London.</p> <p><b>2010</b></p>	<p>The first Trust-wide electronic patient record system begins to roll out.</p> <p><b>2016</b></p>
 <p>First successful separation of conjoined twins in the UK is performed by Prof Ian Aird and Mr Selwyn Taylor at Hammersmith Hospital.</p> <p><b>1953</b></p>	<p>UK's first carotid endarterectomy to prevent stroke performed by Mr HMG Eastcott at St Mary's Hospital.</p> <p><b>1954</b></p>		<p>A blood bank opens at Hammersmith Hospital.</p> <p><b>1988</b></p>	<p>Lead by Prof Robert Winston, the Institute of Reproductive and Developmental Biology opens at Hammersmith Hospital.</p> <p><b>2002</b></p>	<p>In a world first, high intensity ultrasound is used at Hammersmith Hospital to remove part of a patient's rectal tumour.</p> <p><b>2009</b></p>	<p>NHS Five Year Forward View published, setting out a vision for more integrated care.</p> <p><b>2014</b></p>	<p>Charing Cross Hospital trials a new one-stop service for men with suspected prostate cancer, reducing diagnosis times from six weeks to just one week.</p> <p><b>2018</b></p>
