

Warfarin anticoagulation in children Information for parents and carers

Introduction

Your child has been referred to the Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust paediatric haematology team for the monitoring of their warfarin anticoagulation by International Normalised Ratio INR testing. The consultant lead is Dr Helen New, consultant paediatric haematologist, and the team includes a clinical nurse specialist (CNS) and specialist registrar (SpR). Dr New and the CNS will arrange an appointment to meet you in clinic for an introductory session at St Mary's Hospital.

How often will my child need a blood test?

Depending on the stability of the INR, your child may require blood tests frequently (around one to four weekly). A laboratory test of the INR is also usually required after each change of dose of warfarin. Once the INR is stable then testing frequency may be reduced to suit your child's clinical needs.

Every time monitoring is required, your CNS will arrange for your child to attend the hospital for a blood test. Usually no more than 2mls of blood is required for each INR, unless other tests were requested. The hospital staff will make every effort to minimise any stress that you or your child may encounter during the process of taking blood. Once the test is done and the results are available, the CNS will contact you to advise you of any possible changes to the dose of warfarin, and also the date for your child's next blood test.

Do I need to bring anything to my child's appointments?

The 'Yellow Book' anticoagulant therapy record is an essential tool of communication between professionals and families. Please keep it with you at all times and bring it to the hospital whenever you attend for a blood test or for a review. Please remember to enter in this book any relevant information that may be given to you over the telephone or by any other healthcare professional (eg dentist, pharmacist) involved in the care of your child.

Who do I contact for more help and information?

It is important to note that the responsibility for the health of your child in relation to the condition for which he/she is requiring to take anti-coagulation therapy remains in the hands of the referring doctors. If you have any query other than regarding their anti-coagulation monitoring, this should be discussed with the referring team or any alternative contact that they have recommended.
