We are very sorry to confirm that there will not be a drop in support service at the Mint Wing Cottage at St Mary's Hospital from that date. Outreach to sex workers will also not be provided by the Praed Street Project or Working Men Project.

Who you can go to for drop in and outreach services:

Drop-ins and outreach services will be provided by the charity, Turning Point for both sexual health promotion and psychosocial support services.
