The results will be given to the doctor who sent you to us.




Your doctor will talk to you about your X-ray results.









Having an X-ray





At the imaging reception you will be asked to sit in the waiting area.

You may have to lie down on the table.





You may be asked to change into a hospital gown.

The radiographer will move the big camera into position.






An X-ray doesn't hurt and nothing touches you.

You may have to put your hand or foot onto a plate.

The radiographer will move behind the screen while the X-ray is being taken.
