They offer 6-8 counselling sessions to cancer patients and their carers or relatives.	A charity that offers a wider range of emotional, physical and practical support which includes complementary therapies, counselling, nutritional advice, exercise classes, support groups, seminars and courses. They provide healthcare professionally led assessments and 10 hours of free one to one therapy time.	Maggie's provides free practical, emotional and social support to people with cancer, their family and friends. Maggie's Centres are places with professional staff on hand to offer the support people need.	A walk-in cancer information and support centre that delivers a range of services to all people affected by a diagnosis of cancer: to the cancer patient, friends and family, carers, and those bereaved by cancer. Their services include counselling sessions, support groups, complementary and relaxation therapies, one to one support on a drop-in basis, a well- stocked library, information on relevant welfare and benefits, plus a wide range of workshops, social and creative groups.

Inpatient, outpatient, community (including home visits) for patients, carers and families, level 2 training and supervision. 0.8wte available.	A charity that offers wellbeing and emotional support services, free of charge, for those experiencing bereavement, a life limiting illness or those caring for someone with a life limiting illness, including one-to-one counselling and support groups. Also offers counselling to children and young people who have experienced bereavement or have someone close to them with a life-limiting illness. This includes individual counselling for children and young people, therapeutic group work and short-term family work.	Provides care, comfort and support for local people facing life-limiting illnesses.
