PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

Environmental factors have a large impact on stress and fatigue in the workplace.

Design considerations include thermal comfort, accessibility and configuration of space.



AGILE, FLEXIBLE, **SHARED**

Providing a variety of space types in patient free areas will improve staff interaction and ensure a supportive working environment suitable for a wide range of tasks.



BREAKS

Breaks allowing staff to nap, walk outdoors, switching tasks and undertake sensory and social stimulation improve alertness, cognitive performance and decision making abilities. This is particularly beneficial for shift workers.
