Having a CT scan

An easy read guide



At the imaging reception you will be asked to sit in the waiting area.



You will be collected by a radiographer.



You may be asked to change into a hospital gown.



You may need to have a small plastic tube in your hand for a dye injection to make the pictures clearer.

A CT scan doesn't hurt and nothing touches you. The scanner looks like a large Polo® mint.



The radiographer will ask you to lie on the table and they will make you comfortable.



You must lie very still.



The table will move in and out of the hoop taking pictures as it moves.
